Guidelines for study visits to the heart of the European Union













European Parliament (EP)



The European Parliament is the EU's only directly-elected institution. Its 720 Members are there to represent more than 448 million people.

Its official seat is in Strasbourg (France) but much of its work takes place in Brussels.

The visit consists of a presentation by a Parliament communications officer in a meeting room reserved for the group, a dedicated meeting with the MEP if sponsored, a tour of some of the working areas, including the Hemicycle. All activities are free of charge and most are available in each of the European Union's 24 official languages.

Group visits can be organised with or without the support of a Member of the European Parliament (MEP).

MEPs have a budget to support student or youth visits. To find a MEP to sponsor your group:

- Verify if within your school, VET centre or organisation someone has a direct contact with a MEP from your local area
- contact DBI

Be aware: The procedure for requesting sponsorship is quite simple, but expense reporting needs more detailed attention. The Parliament's administrative offices may sometimes be slower in response, and the procedures may seem complex the first time. The exact amount of funding may vary according to the distance from hometown to Brussels and the number of sponsored participants (minimum 10 per group visit), so clear communication with the MEP's office is suggested.

For a MEP sponsored visit, it is required to combine it with the Parlamentarium and the House of European History. Make sure you also book these visits on time.







Group visits without MEPs' sponsorship are always possible but they present three disadvantages:

- lack of financial support
- missed opportunity of a dedicated meeting and dialogue with a MEP
- difficulty, if not impossibility, of attending EP plenary sessions scheduled in Brussels

Visit to the House of European History



The museum offers a unique insight into Europe's shared history through exhibitions, events and a permanent collection.

It offers self-guided visits through tablets or guided-group visits, even with accompanying educational activities designed on your language and age group.

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- **₹** Visiting time: 90 min.

- Time to plan your visit: 6 months in advance if link with your visit to the EU Parliament, otherwise 3-4 weeks in advance.













The Parlamentarium



Visit the Hemicycle or the Parlamentarium to know how the European Parliament works and what it does for European Union citizens.

Through the **Role Play Game**, participants can identify themselves with the role of a Member of the European Parliament. It is suitable for all ages, but is obviously mainly aimed at school students, especially from secondary school upwards. It is available in all languages for groups of minimum 16 and maximum 32 people.

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Only 3 sessions are available per day.

- **Visiting time: 90 min.**

EU Commission (Berlaymont)



The European Commission Visitors' Centre provides an understanding of how the European Commission works, including its policies and priorities.



- **⊗** Group size: 15 100 people
- (5) Minimum visitor age: 15 years old
- **₹ Visiting time:** 90 min. 2½ hours

The Berlaymont palace is only accessible on special occasions, so the visit is usually to the Charlemagne palace, the European Commission Visitors' Centre.
