Basically, these tours were the answer the Association gave to the unlucky deferment



of "Su e Zo per i Ponti di Venezia" ("Up and Down the Bridges of Venice", the solidarity walk TGS Eurogroup has been organising in Venice for over 40 years), as a consequence of the pandemic and the well know restrictions coming with it. Soon, it proved to be an activity that captivated our members and friends and allowed TGS to keep in touch with its family.

Several appointments from May to November early this year offered participants unique walks through Venice. The idea of taking a walk through Venice still remains and, in exchange for the massive "*Su e Zo*" solidarity walk, the Association developed an event intended for a limited number of people on a monthly basis. Thanks to guides' experience, the walks were not just meant to present places and *sestieri* (local districts) in Venice, which you could also experience individually by reading a guidebook or listening to an audioguide by yourself. The guides frequently introduced the story of the people living there, the traditions of the past, historical returns, and the needs of the local residents living in such a peculiar city. Just add that Venice still looks like in the past, with the same buildings and palaces,

There was a good dialogue between the guides and TGS Volunteers, and the two parties worked really well together. All participants felt such an exchange and all the efforts put in place to make everyone feel welcome, which is always a good reward for us. Any association can offer a good tour. TGS is committed to get that "extra and special feeling" among organisers and participants.

Still uncertain on how the worldwide pandemic emergency will develop, we are at work for the next edition of the "Su e Zo per o Ponti di Venezia" (2022 edition, hoping to make it come true again) and for a new series of "Su e Zo Detours" as well.
